SUGGESTED CURRICULUM For CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE (Ages 8-13)

The following suggested curriculum covers six years of study. The courses in the early years are designed to give a basic introduction to the Bible. Depending on the reading level you may want to delay or bring forward some of the courses in the curriculum. The curriculum provides for a variety of book and salvation studies. You may, however, substitute any course according to the needs of the student.

12	7	Lessons For Christian Living (Helps for a believer to grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ)	Journey Through the Bible (Survey of the Bible)	Letter to the Galatians (A study of Galatians focusing the freedom we have in Christ)	Acts (A study of the Book of Acts)
13	8	Gospel of Mark (A study on the Gospel of Mark)	Letter to the Ephesians (A study of Ephesians focusing on Christ and the Church)	Baptism & the Lord's Supper (Clear teaching on these two subjects)	Jerusalem's Gates (A study in the Christian life based on the gates of Jerusalem in the time of Nehemiah)
